

Guiding Principles for Sec 3 Subject Allocation

- Based on students' ability (appropriate level of challenge), aptitude, interest and aspirations for post-secondary education
- Based on school resources and students' take-up rate (viable size).

- Merit Overall Performance (Combined results)
- Take-up rate (vacancy of electives)

Submission of 2020 Sec 3 Subject Combinations Options (Mid-Year)

All Sec 2 students are required to register his/her options online via the website https://sgs.schoolhub.sg from 30 May (Thu), 12 pm to 31 May (Fri), 12 pm.

Each student is required to indicate his/her preferred 4 choices, in order of preference, with the endorsement of his/her parent.

Students are provided with a <u>username</u> and <u>password</u>, to be kept confidential and **not to lose** the username as well as password.
